India International Women's Competitive Programming Championship

Part of Ethos 2025, IIT Guwahati

Event Structure

Step 1: Initial Online Competition:

- Format: 1v1v1v1 Competitive Programming Battles.
- Problems are assigned through a **Discord Bot**.
- Each round consists of **5 problems** in increasing order of difficulty.
- Submissions must be made on Codeforces.
- Point distribution per problem:
 - Q1: 100 points
 - Q2: 200 points
 - Q3: 300 points
 - Q4: 400 points
 - Q5: 500 points
- Only the first correct solve earns the points.
- Time Limit: **25–30 minutes** per round.

Step 2: Progression Rounds:

- Starting pool: 1024 participants.
- Knockout rounds reduce participants progressively to the Top 32.

Step 3: Finalists at IIT Guwahati:

- Top **32 participants** will be invited to IIT Guwahati.
- The finals will be a **3-day event** during **Ethos**.
- Activities include:
 - A grand CP Contest.
 - CP-based fun games and challenges.
 - Networking with peers and mentors.

Step 4: Broadcast and Monitoring:

- All participants must join a Google Meet session.
- Screen sharing is mandatory to ensure fair play.
- The event will be live streamed.

Rules and Regulations

- R1: Each participant must register individually with a valid email, Codeforces profile, and Hackerrank profile.
- **R2:** Participants must join the official Discord server before the event starts.
- **R3:** All solutions must be submitted through **Codeforces**. Submissions on any other platform will not be considered.

R4: Allowed Resources:

- Participants may use their local code editor/IDE.
- Tab-switching between code editor, Codeforces, and official language documentation is allowed.
- IDE features such as syntax highlighting, error detection, and autocomplete are permitted.
- Algorithm reference/tutorial websites (e.g. GeeksforGeeks, CP-Algorithms) are not allowed.
- **R5:** Scoring: Only the first participant to correctly solve a problem is awarded the respective points (100–500).
- **R6:** Any attempt to copy code, seek help, or use unauthorized external resources may result in immediate disqualification.

R7: Technical Issues:

- In case of screen-sharing failure, participants must immediately notify the organizers.
- A maximum of 5 minutes will be given to resolve the issue. Beyond this, the participant may be moved to a backup round or marked disqualified.
- Connectivity failures will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis by the judges.
- R8: In case of ties, additional tie-breaker problems will be given.
- **R9:** Judges' decision will be final and binding.
- **R10:** Finalists must confirm their travel and participation in Ethos within the given deadline
- **R11:** All finalists are expected to follow the code of conduct of IIT Guwahati and the Coding Club.

Prizes and Recognition

- Cash Prizes for top performers.
- Medals and goodies for all who make it to IIT Guwahati.
- Participation Certificate for every registered participant.
